“Crazy Quilt Swing Purse”



Let's leave those big purses at home. This small bag is smart and stylish. Use basic piecing and decorate with Victorian embellishments. Images can be seen on Page 48 “Crazy Quilt Odyssey” and Page 23 & 111 “Art and Inspiration”. There are three shapes to choose from: rectangle, circle and oval.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine (clean and in good working order)
 - Variety of ribbons: satin, sheer & wire – 3/8” to 1/2” wide
 - 9” square template plastic
 - Velcro circle fastener
 - Water erasable pen
 - Buttons and doodads
 - 9” square muslin
- 9” x 16” fleece or needle punch material
 - 1/4 yard heavy moiré, satin or velvet for backing and lining
 - Beads, Nymo thread
 - 1/4 yard iron-on stiffener
 - Scraps of fancy fabrics (variety of textures, solids, prints)
 - Laces, doilies & hankies
 - (2) - (7) 45” long rattail cords (Cording can include: threads, yarns, trims, gimp or cord in a variety of thickness and texture.)
 - Variety of Embroidery Threads
 - 4 mm silk ribbon – variety of colors

PLUS: This basic supply list is what I think all students should always bring to any needlework or quilting class, regardless of the actual class supply list. It is a good idea to keep these supplies in a small container for convenience.

Needles: Darning, #10 Sharps, Beading, Crewel, Chenille, Tapestry and Embroidery

Paper and pencil for notes

Washout markers

White marking pencil, mechanical pencil

Tacky glue and glue stick

Measuring tape, see-through ruler, straight pins

Paper and fabric scissors

Green embroidery thread and gray sewing thread

Embroidery hoop 6”

Art paper for sketches and patterns
