# Upcoming Programs

Phyllis Rueckert, Vice President – Programs & Workshops

Our guest lecturer in March will be Julie Silber. With over twenty-five years of experience in the broad areas of Amish and early American quilts, Ms. Silber has organized some of the most significant quilt shows in modern quilt history, from “American Quilts: A Handmade Legacy” at the Oakland Museum in 1981 to “Amish: The Art of the Quilt” at the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco in 1990. She is also the co-producer of the book by the same title, *Amish: The Art of the Quilt*, with text by Robert Hughes published by Alfred A. Knopf in 1993 (a must book for lovers of Amish quilts). She is also the curator of several collections, including the Esprit Collection, and a consultant to Levi Strauss & Co. of San Francisco.

Working with an internationally recognized team of quilt experts, Julie has also established The Quilt Complex. It offers a full range of quilt-related services to individuals, museums, dealers and corporations. It specializes in quilt exhibition packages of antique Amish and other American quilts. In addition, drawing on many years of experience and research, it offers consulting on display, storage, acquisitions, publishing, and documentation of quilts and quilt collections.

Julie’s lecture topic for the **March 4, 2010** meeting will be **Keep’em in Stitches: America’s Funniest Quilts**.

Learn and laugh – really laugh-along with Julie and some hilarious quilts. American women have always expressed their whole selves in quilts – their tragedies, accomplishments, losses, loves passages and humor! Slides and real-life examples of some very, very funny quilts - both 19th and early 20th century - will be shared.

There will be no workshops in March, as the show is upon us.

April will bring one of our favorite “homegirls” back for a meeting! **Karen Kleespies Stone** began quilting in 1986, teaching in 1990, and publishing her designs in 1993. *Electric Quilt* published *Karen K Stone Quilts* in 2004, now in subsequent printings, and another book is in the works. Her quilts have won numerous awards, including first prizes in international competitions, have appeared on covers of *Quilter’s Newsletter Magazine*, and quilts made from her patterns appear frequently in exhibition. Her *Indian Orange Peel* received the People’s Choice Award at Quilt National ’95, and she has appeared on HGTV’s *Simply Quilts*. Most recently, her *Clam Session* quilt was awarded “Master of Innovative Artistry” at the 2009 International Quilt Festival.

Karen holds degrees in Piano from Baylor and Indiana Universities, has two lovely daughters, several cats and a dog, and divides her time between homes in Dallas and Beaumont, Texas.

Since Karen’s lecture will coincide with April Fool’s Day, rather than a formal “canned” speech, Karen is going to let her hair down (so to speak) and give us a more casual presentation. We will get a glimpse of the influences that have made her the quilter she is today; her friends, her family, her non-quilting passions, the quirky “obsessions du jour,” and more. Expect to see some of her quilts “in person.”

## Friday, April 2 Workshop: Improvisational String Piecing on Foundations

Achieve precision and perfection without feeling oppressed. And you’re the designer! (relax – it’s fun!)

Techniques from Karen’s New York Beauty, Happy Rick-Rack, and Cactus Flower quilts.

## For Sale by Guild Members: QUILTS!

Over the years, a question often asked by visitors to the show or inquiring about the show was "Will there be quilts for sale?" While there are vendors marketing antique quilts, there were few finished quilts available.

So... in 2009, the show committee decided to pilot a quilt sales booth that would allow Guild members to market their creations to the public. The effort was successful enough that we are sponsoring a booth again this year.

If you are a member of the Quilters Guild of Dallas (in good standing as of January 1, 2010,) you can take advantage of this quilt-consignment opportunity during the show. This year, we have added the option of offering quilts displayed in the judged show for sale as well. All quilts offered for consignment must be in good condition and have been made within the last 10 years. The owner of the quilt sets the sale price, which will be non-negotiable by the buyer. If sold, the Guild will keep 15% of the

sale price as a consignment fee, and a check will be sent to the owner/seller for the remaining 85%.

A sales contract is posted on the Guild website for easy download. This must be completed/submitted to Margaret Wolf no later than March 1st. Then, each quilt is consigned for a period of only five days (delivered to Market Hall on Wednesday, March 10th and if unsold, picked up on Sunday, March 14th after the show closes). During the show, the quilts will be displayed in a booth in the Special Exhibits/Concession area in the North Hall.

If you know someone who has been looking for a quilt, please let them know about our booth. We will accept both checks and credit cards.

These bargain books and magazines can be a goldmine for the individual quilter looking for specific techniques, patterns or just a good read.
