The Winedale Historical Complex hosts its annual quilt exhibition Feb. 12 – Feb. 25, 2012 with "Making Do with Little: Cotton Sacks and Cotton Sack Quilts." This year's show includes quilts, cotton sacks, and cotton sack fabric swatches, plus cotton sack clothing, dishtowels, table linens, aprons, and pillowcases.

The exhibition opens with a reception on February 12 from 1-3 p.m. Exhibition hours are from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., Feb. 13-25. The reception and exhibition are free and open to the public.

Winedale, located near Round Top, Texas, is a division of The University of Texas's Briscoe Center for American History.

To schedule an Appraisal Appointment:

- Simply fill out the appraisal form (available on our website or in your 2011-12 Directory)
- Mail with appropriate fees to address indicated on form.

Appraisals will be mailed within two weeks of the close of the show.

Guild members, you are amazing.

Thanks to everyone who has donated to date. So far, we have collected fifty-two (52) miniatures! We think this is some kind of record this far ahead of the show.

That said, we can certainly use the one that you are working on right now. Please have your miniature to us by February 1, if you want your mini included in the online auction. Of course, we will continue to accept quilts after that date; your friends just won't be able to admire it online.

As a reminder the proceeds from the auction will go to the **Hobby Crafters Foundation**. This foundation will use the funds we raise to both purchase materials for making some of the thousands of handmade toys that these men and women make and distribute to needy children in the Dallas area, and for some needed maintenance on their workshop and woodworking tools.

Final submission for the miniature quilt auction is Tuesday, February 28. Please mail or personally deliver your miniature to Bonnie McElearney, 10129 Mapleridge Drive, Dallas, Texas 75238. The miniature can be dropped through the mail slot in the front door, if no one is at home.

What is a quilt appraisal and why should you have one? There are three basic types of appraisals:

- Insurance Appraisal – Determines the replacement value of your quilt or garment.
- Fair Market Appraisal – Determines the market value which is a figure agreed upon between a willing buyer and a willing seller, both with knowledge.
- Tax Donation Appraisal – For someone who wants to donate a piece for any reason to any type of organization or place, or to establish a value for an estate/family, often after a death.

During Dallas Quilt Celebration, our appraisers conduct appraisals for Insurance Replacement Value unless otherwise specified. American Quilter's Society (AQS) Certified Appraisers will be available by appointment during the show to give written appraisals of quilts and quilted garments. The Appraisal Committee will schedule appointments every half hour. The cost of each appraisal is \$40.00

Our appraisers are:

Denise Bartosh – Denise is an AQS Certified Appraiser of quilted textiles and has served as a lecturer for Guilds throughout Texas. She does quilt restorations and has served as a quilt show judge. She is a member of the Professional Association of Appraisers of Quilted Textiles (PAAQT), American Quilt Study Group (AQSG), and the American Quilter's Society (AQS). Denise lives in Garland, Texas with her husband and two boys and is a first grade teacher with the Dallas Public School system.

Lisa Erlandson – Lisa is a compulsive quilt collector whose habit has led to several quilt-related specialties. Besides being an AQS Certified Appraiser of quilted textiles, she is a quilt restorer, lecturer and quilt historian. In 2002, she was named "Best Quilt Restorer" by D Home and Garden Magazine. When not restoring and repairing new and old quilts, she finds time to make a few quilts for herself. Lisa and her husband live outside Gainesville, Texas.

With winter here (sort of,) what's better on a cold blustery day than to curl up with a good book? And a good quilting book to ignite your creative fire will help warm you up! The rest of our newly ordered books are in the *Projects & Designs*, *Technique and Pictorial* genres.

The 11 new titles in the Projects and Designs category include:

- *Farmer's Wife Sampler Quilt* - letters from 1920's farm wives and the 111 blocks they inspired.
- *Quilt Fiesta* - surprising designs from Mexican tiles using fusible applique.
- *Remembering Adelia: Quilts Inspired by her Diary* - 14 projects from the Civil War era.
- Two Jo Morton books: *Jo Morton Coming Home* and *Remembrances*

Five new Technique Books include:

We have three books on quilting designs, covering freemotion, continuous line designs and feathers, and also got these two fascinating books:

- *501 Quilting Motifs: Designs for Hand or Machine Quilting* - from 26 years of Quiltmaker magazine. Includes clear guidelines for selecting motifs.
- *Allie Aller's Crazy Quilting: Modern Piecing and Embellishing Techniques for Joyful Stitching* - combining traditional methods with modern fabric tricks.

The 4 new pictorial books are:

- *Fabric+Paint+Thread= Fabulous* by Pat Durbin - step-by-step directions to create beautiful pictorial quilts from photographs.
- *Point, Click, Quilt! Turn your Photos into Fabulous Fabric Art* by Susan Brubaker Knapp - how to compose digital photos and turn them into art quilts.
- *Quick Little Landscape Quilts* by Joyce Becker - 24 techniques, from tulle overlays to Angelina fibers.
- *Thread Painting With Style* by Nancy Prince - walks you through the materials and methods of thread painting, including a very useful troubleshooting chapter.

Just stop by the Library area before the guild meeting and we can help you find the books you're looking for. The books are arranged by genre and then alphabetically by author on the book carts. Check-out is simple: All you need is your name and guild membership number to check out up to 4 books for one month.
