For those who weren't able to attend the March Guild meeting, you missed some beautiful quilts. Jane's "ladies" along with her amazing tree quilts and other designs in her trunk show, certainly got the imagination of many attendees racing. Her jacket was also stunning. Something for all to consider as inspiration for an "apparel" entry in next year's quilt show.

We are having a really great response to Gwen Marston who will be coming to us in April from Beaver Island, Michigan. A professional quilt artist, author and teacher, she has taught quilting nationally and internationally for more than 30 years. The author of 24 books, she has also been a regular contributing columnist for *Lady's Circle Patchwork Quilts* as well as many other magazines.

Gwen has been the featured quilt artist in 21 solo exhibits and her work has been shown in many group exhibitions throughout the world.

Her lecture will be a trunk show illustrating quilts from her book "Ideas and Inspirations: Abstract Quilts in Solids." She will discuss her work in solids and point out some of the great characteristics inherent in these beautiful fabrics. Although originally inspired by Amish quilts, Gwen's are very Liberated.



At this time, her Saturday workshop is full with a waiting list started, and a few (very few) slots remain for her Friday workshop, "Liberated Baskets."

Upcoming Programs:

In May, we will be treated to the creativity of Tom Russell from Katy, TX. Tom is an award-winning quilter who only started his quilting journey in 2000. He has been featured on Alex Anderson's "Simply Quilts" and was selected by Alex to participate in one of her quilt challenges. Tom has designed patterns for HGTV and appeared on Quilt Central on PBS. His work has also found its way into Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, The Quilter and Quilting Arts.

Tom will present a lecture on his journey into quilting and do a one-day workshop Friday, May 6th called "Scrapbag Bouquet."

In June, prepare to be dazzled by Marti Michell, creator of the "Perfect Patchwork Templates" and her "From Marti Michell" line of acrylic templates and specialty rulers for rotary cutting. If you have ever needed a tool to make that challenging design, Marti has made the perfect set to help you. She is the recipient of the 2004 "Silver Star Honoree" lifetime achievement award at Houston International Quilt Festival for being a pioneer of the current quilt revival.
