We will have **Deborah Boschert** from Crofton, MD presenting a Thursday evening lecture on "Art Quilt Collaborative." She will be sharing with us all the behind-the-scenes stories about how twelve fiber artists from all over the world created a collection of 144 art quilts and published a book about the art and the experience. She will also be discussing a variety of techniques, materials and designs, plus offer tips for collaborative art projects and creating an artistic community. This sounds like a great challenge opportunity for Friendship Groups.

Friday, September 2nd Workshop

Deborah's Friday workshop will also be a hoot! In "Small Art Quilts: Designing a Series", we will learn how to create a complete series of fiber art incorporating common elements. From there, we will use the elements and principles of design to direct improvisational compositions. There will be tons of ideas for completely bursting through any creative blocks. No rules, just fun! No Saturday this month.



Coming in October

In October we have Karen Eckmeier from Kent, Connecticut visiting to present her lecture, "Happy Villages & Accidental Landscapes." She will be sharing with us her two favorite approaches to playing with fabrics: Fabric collage and layered/topstitching. This lighthearted and informative power point presentation will show you how the techniques evolved and will inspire you to try and put your own spin on them. She will also be doing workshops using these techniques. Friday will be "Accidental Landscape: Mountain Views" and Saturday will be "Happy Villages."

2011 Endowment Award Recipients

The Quilter's Guild of Dallas has an Endowment Committee whose responsibility is to publish the Guild's criteria for Grant Awards on our Guild website and to review the applications that are received each year. This year, our Board approved changing the name to "Quilter's Guild of Dallas Helena Hibbs Endowment Fund," and increasing the amount of Grant Funds available each year to \$10,000. The funds are awarded, in full or in part, to individuals or organizations with a need for funding assistance for their projects that will further the art of quilting.

The Endowment Committee reviewed nine grant applications this year. One was disqualified for not being complete. Of the remaining eight, three were deemed worthy of our grant monies.

The recipients for our 2010-2011 grant year are:

Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum - \$2,500

\$2,500 to help fund a 2012 exhibit called "*Male Call: Quilts by Men*". They began holding biennial exhibits with a focus on men quilters in the 1990s. Over 50 men were featured in their 2010 exhibit including Ricky Tims, David Taylor, Joe Cunningham and Connor Bingham, a 17 year old longarm quilter who quilted a "trapunto" design on his log cabin quilt.

The new exhibit will run from January 30 – April 28, 2012. It will be publicized on the RMQM website (www.rmqm.org), RMQM e-newsletter, RMQM Face Book page, www.bouldercountyyarts.org, Men quilters Yahoo chat group (by Steve Bowley, an RMQM member), press release sent to Denver metro area artist guilds, an Exhibit Postcard and Gallery Guide as well as posters in the front window of the museum.

Aimee E. Newell, Ph.D. – \$5,000

Ms. Newell is a well-known and respected historian and quilt authority. She has served as the Director of Collections, Senior Curator of Collections and Curator of Collections for the National Heritage Museum, Lexington, MA. She has also served as Curator of Collections, Curator of Textiles and Fine Arts for Old Sturbridge Village, Sturbridge, MA and the Nantucket Historical Association, Nantucket, MA. Additionally, she has had over 40 articles published pertaining to quilting, textiles, embroidery, etc.

The \$5,000 is to be used to help in the publication of a book about needlework made by women aged 40 and over between 1820 and 1860. Tentatively titled "A Stitch In Time: The Needlework of Aging Women in Antebellum America," it explores the antebellum era explicitly, an earlier period than many quilt histories explore. Her book looks at quilts made throughout antebellum United States and focuses on how the quilts functioned socially for their makers and their families.

The book is to be published by Ohio University Press who plans to release it not only in the U.S., but also in Europe and Japan with a release date in 2013.

New England Quilt Museum – \$2,500

The purpose of the museum's application was to obtain funding assistance for an upcoming exhibit entitled "Backstitch: A 25 Year Retrospective of Advances & Milestones in Quiltmaking", which is being created to help in the celebration of the 25th anniversary of the founding of the museum. The exhibit will examine the evolution of quilting over the past twenty-five years through the development of new tools, techniques and methodology of many influential quilters. The exhibit will be a visual documentation of this time period and the advances and milestones that have occurred.

Some of the quilters being considered for this exhibit are Alex Anderson, Charlotte Warr Anderson, Barbara W. Barber, Jinny Beyer, Sandy Bonsib, Barbara Brackman, Eleanor Burns, Hollis Chatelain, Jane Burch Cochran, Jo Diggs, Carol Doak, Christine Fries-Ureel, Carol Anne Grotrian, Harriet Hargrave, Mickey Lawler, Therese May, Paula Nadelstern, Sue Nickels, Brenda Papadakis, Bethany Reynolds, Elly Sienkiewicz, Ami Simms, Linda Taylor and Laura Wasilowski.

The \$2,500 is for contract labor, etc. in production of the exhibit.

Borders can be more than an afterthought.

If you've ever looked at the beautiful quilt top you've just finished piecing and wondered, 'ok now what do I do, it still needs something', one of these books may be for you. The Library has several books on borders filled with ideas that will enhance your center design area without stealing the show and yet provide a natural stopping point at the outer edge.

- Jinny Beyer's: *The Quilter's Album of Blocks and Borders* is a veritable encyclopedia of blocks indexed by name and type of design.
- John Flynn's: *Braided Borders* gives the specifics on creating a spectacular braided border.
- Shirley Liby describes the how-to's of pieced borders in: *Borders, Borders, Borders*.
- Sally Schneider provides an abundance of diagrams and tips incorporating quilting borders into the piecing of blocks to simplify construction in: *Traditional Quilts with Painless Borders*.
- Peggy Martin's: *Quick-Strip Paper Piecing: For Blocks, Borders and Quilts* is a book for both beginners and experienced quilters.
- Paulette Peters' comprehensive book about designing borders: *Borders by Design* treats borders as a design element that integrates with and frames the quilt. Three principles of border design are described: divide the side, use the unit and connect the corner. This is also a book for new and experienced quilters alike.

JUDGED SHOW ENTRY RULES & REQUIREMENTS

Thank you for your interest in the 31th annual Dallas Quilt Celebration, sponsored by the Quilter's Guild of Dallas, Inc. Entries will be evaluated by a panel of nationally recognized judges, and ribbon awards are given at the discretion of the judges. Questions about rules or entry forms should be directed to **Shelly Guibert**: email – shellygoodwyn@yahoo.com or phone 972-618-0100.

Entry Submission

Entries will not be accepted until ALL required items are received and the entry form is **COMPLETELY and accurately filled out with the "Hold Harmless Agreement" signed by the entrant.**

We will attempt to contact senders of incomplete information via phone or email. If a response is not received within five days, the incomplete entry form(s) will be returned.

Entry Deadline:

Thursday, January 5, 2012

The 2012 Entry Form, along with other requested entry materials, must be received by this date. Entries may be delivered in person at Guild meetings up to and including this date, or via mail to:

Late entries will be returned. We are not responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

Entry Limits:

- Each entrant may submit a maximum of four (4) entries. Only the first 400 entries received will be accepted.
- Entries received/presented after the 400 quilt limit is reached will be returned.

Each entry shall consist of:

- **Completed Entry Form** (including signatures & contact info)
- **Guild membership number and/or appropriate fees**
- **\$1.00 bill (cash)** - covers cost of mailing entry delivery materials to you once layout is complete.

- **One CLEAR printed color photo** of the entry (can be any white paper up to letter-size), labeled with the entrant's name, quilt title and size dimensions of entry indicated (width X length). Photos will **not** be returned.

Entrants:

- Each entry may have only **ONE ENTRANT**. The name on the "entrant" line must match the release signature on the form.
- Entrant must be either the owner of the quilt(s) or garment(s) entered or have been involved in the execution /making of the quilt.

- Non-members of the Guild pay a non-refundable entry fee of \$15.00 per entry.
- Entries in category 401 Juniors (age 17 and under) are exempt from entry fees.

Shipping Fees (if applicable):

- \$20.00/entry for entries to be returned via UPS (exclusively)
- Note: Checks are accepted for entry, membership or shipping fees, but please keep the \$1.00 cash separate.*

Entry Fees:

- Guild members in good standing (dues paid) are exempt from entry fees.

Entry Form & Entry Materials

Divisions/Categories

- A **Category number** must be clearly indicated on the Entry Form.
- The Masters and Artisan divisions are determined by the eligibility of the "maker" of the quilt.
The Guild defines the "maker" as the person who made the quilt top. (Important for entries in Artisan 2-person)
- Most categories in the Masters and Artisan divisions are denoted as "ONE PERSON." This means that one person did ALL the work – piecing, appliqué, quilting, etc.
DO NOT enter a quilt professionally quilted by someone else in any of the "one person" categories.

- The Entries Committee, in conjunction with the Judges and Awards Committee, reserves the right to:
(a) determine the final placement of quilts in categories, and
(b) to combine or divide categories in order to facilitate judging.
- **All quilts entered must have at least the top completed at the time of entry submission.** (The required photo needs to SHOW THE QUILT – not just a pile of fabric or a crude sketch of an idea.)

Other Rules

- Entries may not have been displayed in the judged show of any previous Dallas Quilt Celebration.
- Entries in judged categories must have been completed after **January 1, 2007**, and be clean and in good condition.
- No substitution of the original entry will be allowed.
- The Quilter's Guild of Dallas, Inc. reserves the right to refuse any entry deemed inappropriate or which fails to meet entry and/or delivery requirements.

Quilting/Construction Requirements

- All entries entered in quilt categories must be quilted with the exception of cathedral window quilts, yo-yo quilts, crazy quilts or garments.

Other Rules (continued)

Quilting/construction (continued)

- No tied quilts will be allowed.
- Fused edges must be finished in a manner appropriate to the category.
- Entries in Category 306 – Garments must include a recognizable amount of quilting, appliqué OR piecing techniques used.
- All entries MUST remain on display for the duration of the show.

Entries May Not:

- Be framed and/or under glass
- Include complicated rigid frames, rods or mounting devices without prior approval from the entries committee
- Include embellishments with sharp edges that could be hazardous to volunteers or visitors.

Entry Withdrawals

We strongly discourage the withdrawal of entries from the show.

- If you find you must withdraw an entry, the Entries Chairman (Shelly Guibert) must be notified via email or phone NO LATER than 4:30 CST on **Wednesday, February 22, 2012** – two weeks prior to the stated delivery date (03/07/2012).

- **Entrants who fail to notify Entries Chairman (Shelly Guibert – 972-618-0100) by the above date (02/22/12) that an entry is being withdrawn, will forfeit their eligibility to submit entries for the 2012 show.**

Rules for Display

- Each entry must have a fabric identification label sewn on the back of the quilt. No PINS! The label must include your name, the title of the quilt/garment, your home address and quilt dimensions. For convenience and consistency, we prefer the lower left hand corner of the back. Labels for garment entries should be stitched to the inside of the ensemble piece(s).
- Every quilt must have an open-ended 4" diameter rod pocket (Quilt Hanging Sleeve) stitched to the top of the back of the quilt. Quilts longer than 86" must have a second sleeve attached no more than 86" from the bottom edge of the quilt. The only exceptions to the 4" rule are quilts that are 24" square or smaller may use smaller rod pockets of only 2" in diameter.
- Each quilt entry must be submitted in an individual fabric bag/ pillowcase with the entrant's name, address and phone number written in permanent/indelible marker either directly onto the bag or on a label firmly stitched to the bag. Garment entries may be submitted in a garment bag with same information.
Note: Prior to hanging, the bag is all that is between your entry and a bare cement floor. We don't want your entry to get dirt-damaged any more than you do...
- You will receive a color-coded index card with placement information for each entry along with delivery information in mid-February. This is to be attached with a safety pin to the OUTSIDE of the bag.

Information Regarding Cash & Ribbon Awards

- QGD distributes over \$15,000.00 in cash awards: *Best of Show* - \$1,000.00; *in all judged categories*: First Place-\$300.00, Second Place-\$200.00, Third Place-\$100.00. There are also a number of special award ribbons with cash awards as well.
- The QGD considers the entrant to be the "owner" of the quilt. Hence, this individual will be the recipient of any prize money and ribbon(s) won.
- QGD awards the ribbon to the QUILT, not individuals involved in the making of same. Therefore, duplicate ribbons are NOT available.
- IRS guidelines require that a 1099 form be filed for all entrants winning \$600 or more total. Prize money will not be released before information has been received by the Guild for IRS reporting purposes.

No "Notice of Acceptance"

- The Dallas show is not juried. Therefore, entrants will not hear from us until we mail out the delivery instructions (usually mid-February.) Please be aware that we have no way of knowing if your entry forms got lost or misdirected in the mail.
- If you wish to receive confirmation that your entry materials were received prior to reaching our maximum of 400 entries, please include a self-addressed/stamped postcard listing the items you have entered. We will check off the entry forms received and drop the card into return mail.

Delivery Information

- Entrants will receive complete delivery and/or shipping instructions by return mail, usually in mid-February (the \$1.00 CASH fee covers cost of envelope, postage, labels, etc.)
- Included in this packet will be color-coded index cards for each entry as well as more detailed delivery instructions. Entries delivered late will not be accepted for exhibit – no exceptions.

Entries to be delivered in person at Market Hall:

- All entries that are delivered in person must be brought to Dallas Market Hall between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on **Wednesday, March 7, 2012**. It is permissible for your designee to deliver the entry.

Entries to be Shipped (Delivery)

- All entries that are shipped from out of town must be received by Shelly Guibert no later than **February 29, 2012**.

DIVISIONS & CATEGORIES

- A Division/Category **must** be indicated on the Entry Form.
- The Entries Committee, in conjunction with the Judges and Awards Committee, reserves the right to determine final placement of quilts in categories and to combine or divide categories in order to facilitate judging.
- Divisions are determined by the eligibility of the “maker” of the quilt. QGD defines the “maker” as the person who made the quilt top.

Master Division

If ANY of the following statements are true, you must enter under the “Master” division:

- You are a quilter or maker of wearable art and you sell/have sold your work.
- You teach/have taught quilting or wearable art techniques.
- You have had a quilt compete in the Master Division of the Dallas Quilt Celebration in the past.
- You have published a quilt or wearable art book or pattern.
- You have won a total of two or more blue ribbons in any combination of the following: Dallas Quilt Celebration, county, state, national or international quilting competitions.
- You have had a quilt or garment juried into a highly prestigious exhibit, such as Quilt National, etc.).

101 Large Pieced (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and primarily patchwork; either hand or machine quilted.

102 Large Appliqué (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and primarily appliqué, either hand or machine quilted.

103 Wall Quilt (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt made for display on a wall. No side may EXCEED 72”. May be pieced, appliqué or combination; hand or machine quilted.

104 Two-Person Wall Quilts

A quilt made specifically for display on a wall. No side may EXCEED 72” and two people were involved in the making. May be pieced or appliqué; hand or machine quilted.

105 Two-Person Large Quilts

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and two people were involved in the making. May be pieced or appliqué; hand or machine quilted.

106 Art Quilts (ONE PERSON)

Original design; any technique or combination of techniques or materials used in a non-traditional way.

Artisan Division

If ALL of the following statements are true, you may enter under the “Artisan” division:

- You have never sold your work (quilts or wearable art).
- You have never formally taught quilting or wearable art techniques.
- You have never been classified as a “Master” in the past.
- You have never published a pattern or a book on quilting/wearable art techniques.
- You have won no more than one blue ribbon in any combination of the following: Dallas Quilt Celebration, county, state, national or international quilting competitions.
- You have never had a quilt or garment juried into a highly prestigious exhibit (Ex: Quilt National, The Bernina Fashion Show, etc.).

201 Large Pieced (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and primarily patchwork; either hand or machine quilted.

202 Large Appliqué (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and primarily appliqué, either hand or machine quilted.

203 Wall Quilt (ONE PERSON)

Any quilt made for display on a wall. No side may EXCEED 72”. May be pieced, appliqué or combination; hand or machine quilted.

204 Two-Person Wall Quilts

A quilt made specifically for display on a wall. No side may EXCEED 72” and two people were involved in the making. May be pieced or appliqué; hand or machine quilted.

205 Two-Person Large Quilts

Any quilt which is LARGER THAN 72” on any one side and two people were involved in the making. May be pieced or appliqué; hand or machine quilted.

206 Art Quilts (ONE PERSON)

Original design; any technique or combination of techniques or materials used in a non-traditional way.

207 First Quilt (ONE PERSON)

First quilt entered in a judged quilt show.

Open Division

Master or Artisan

301 Miniature Quilts (one or two person)

Any quilt which has no side measuring more than 24”. Any technique may be used. If interior blocks are part of the design, these blocks must measure 4” or less.

302 Other Techniques (one or two person)

White work, Embroidered, Cathedral Window, Yo-Yo, Crazy Quilts or any other quilt that doesn’t fit into the pieced, appliqué or art quilt categories. May be hand or machine quilted.

303 Group/Friendship

Made by a group of three or more persons.

304 Seniors (one or two person)

Any quilt made by a quilter 65 years of age or over. (Note: Seniors are not limited to this category; they are also eligible for Master or Artisan Division categories as appropriate.)

305 Show Chair’s Theme: “In Full Bloom”

These can be any interpretation of the theme.

306 Garment (one or more persons)

Must include a recognizable amount of patchwork, appliqué and/or quilting.

307 Pictorial (one or more persons)

A pictorial quilt forms a picture which takes over the entire quilt. This includes landscapes, portraits, still lifes, interiors, etc. whole cloth quilts which have been painted to create an image and are quilted are considered pictorial quilts.

Non-Judged Categories

401 Juniors (17 and under)*

Any quilt made by a quilter age 17 or under. These quilts may utilize any piecing, appliqué or quilting method, may be an individual, two-person, or group effort, and can be any size.

**ALL ENTRANTS IN THIS CATEGORY RECEIVE A SPECIAL COMMEMORATIVE RIBBON AND ARE EXEMPT FROM ENTRY FEES.*

402 Adults:

Any quilt or garment that the entrant wishes to “show,” but does not wish to have judged. May use any techniques. Any number of “makers” may be involved.
