Coming in July 2010 are **Betsy Chutchian** and **Betty Edgell**.

Betsy Chutchian's love of quilts began as a child. She has been making quilts since 1980 and teaching since 1990. She is the author of several quilting books, the newest being *Gone to Texas, Quilts from a Pioneer Woman's Journal*. Betsy works and teaches at Lone Star House of Quilts in Arlington, Texas and gives programs and workshops throughout the state. She is co-founder of the quilting group, 19th Century Patchwork Divas. Her most recent adventure comes as a fabric designer for Blue Hill Fabrics with her first line, Hot for Chocolate, shipping now to quilt shops across the country.

Betty Edgell has been quilting since 1971 and has taught at several quilt shops in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. She is a charter member of the 19th Century Patchwork Divas, who have been featured in *Quilter's Newsletter Magazine* and participated in two special exhibits in Houston. Their quilts have been on a traveling exhibit in Pittsburg, Chicago, and Long Beach and were featured in a special showing at the Quilt Museum in Golden, Co. Betty has also co-authored several books, one of which was the very popular Seasonal Table Runner book for Design Originals and Cotton & Ewe.

Their July 1 Program is entitled "19th Century Reproduction Quilts." The program and trunk show cover styles and fabrics for quilt making during the 19th Century made for today using the great variety available from today's fabric manufacturers. You will see many beautiful quilts.

Block Contest 2011

The annual Block Contest is part of the judged show at Dallas Quilt Celebration. It carries the same prize purse as the other judged categories - 1st (\$300), 2nd (\$200), 3rd (\$100), and also has Honorable Mention awards. But, instead of an entire quilt or garment to slave over, all an entrant has to do is make a block that reflects the theme of the challenge and adheres to the other rules set forth by the chairman. After the show, the finished blocks will be assembled into a quilt that will become part of the *Keeper Quilt Collection*.

This year, 2011 Quilt Celebration block contest theme will be "stars." However, these won't be just your ordinary star blocks; they will include lots of points, feature deep jewel colors and showcase precision piecing that would make our June workshop teacher, Sally Collins, proud! It has been many years since the guild has done a pieced block for the block contest, but we feel that a pieced block theme is long overdue. Participating is an opportunity to demonstrate your ability to create perfect star points.

For all of you Guild members who enjoy the challenge of star points and precision piecing you will want to pick up a packet. For more information or to obtain your contest packet, see Marcia Hampton at the guild meetings. The cost of the packet with challenge fabric, contest rules and release form are available to guild members for \$10. The \$10 is returned to you when you turn in your block. Deadline for turning in completed blocks is the March 2011 guild meeting.

Silent Auction Benefitting the North Texas Food Bank

For the first time since its 1982 creation, the food bank is facing a financial shortfall. President and CEO Jan Pruitt expects to end this fiscal year next month having raised \$250,000 less than budgeted. Because each of those dollars can be converted into four meals, falling short could have devastating consequences.

The food bank serves as the distribution hub for nearly 1,200 feeding locations. As contributions to this important organization have fallen off, the number of clients seeking help from these programs has jumped – meaning that more people are going home with less food.

Here, in the state with the highest percentage of families classified as “food insecure,” the North Texas Food Bank provides an essential safety net. In Dallas County, every third child lives in poverty. And a growing number of other families are among the working poor who too often choose between buying food and paying bills.

As officials brace for what they call the hungriest months of the year – when students no longer can rely on meals at school – the food bank needs North Texas’ help.

Quilt Country, the quilt store in Lewisville, and a long-time Dallas Guild supporter, has decided to hold a “silent” auction of miniature quilts to benefit the food bank.

If you would like to make a miniature quilt donation for the auction, the rules are simple:

- Completely finish, bind and label your quilt donation.
- Size - minimum - 4” X 6”, maximum - 12” X 12”
- Materials - Traditional piecing and appliqué, mixed media, any embellishments, dangles, points, etc are fine.
- In some way permanently put your name, city/state and the date on the back of your quilt. This can be done with a marker or a label.
- Bring or mail your mini to Quilt Country by 5:00PM on Thursday, July 1.
- Include an index card, or similar size paper with your name, email address, address, phone number and the title of your artwork. The shop will notify donors via email the total amount raised for the food bank and also tell you about the bidding on your piece.

Summer is a time for trips and vacations. Have you ever thought about taking one of those vacation photos and turning it into a landscape quilt? Our library has several wonderful books that can help you make a realistic landscape quilt or one that is more abstract. Below are just a few of the books we have about making landscape quilts. Stop by the Library table at the next meeting for a complete list.

Happy reading!

- *A Bridge to Landscape Quilts* by Mary Hackett takes the reader through a step-by-step process of how to build a picture. She also provides input on fabric choice, image selection, perspective and composition.
- *Fractured Landscape Quilts* by Katie Pasquini Masopust starts with photographs of landscapes but then she breaks up the surfaces with lines, angles and curves to create richly textured and intricately patterned quilts.
- *Free-Style Quilts: A "No Rules" Approach* by Susan Carlson takes a more free-style collage approach. Good tips for choosing fabric, drawing patterns and finishing methods are included.
- *Landscape Quilts* by Nancy Zieman and Natalie Sewell with nearly 300 color photographs covers everything from creating water on fabric to creating woodland scenes.
- *Luminous Landscapes: Quilted Visions in Paint & Thread* by Gloria Loughman is a concise, clearly illustrated book on how to create every aspect of landscapes. Even beginners will find this book easy to understand.

Dallas Guild Mini-Quilt Auction

WE are proud to announce another successful Miniature Quilt Auction. Thanks again to everyone who participate.

Here are some of the statistics:

- A check for \$5800.11 was raised for the **Senior Source**.
- \$ 71.41 was average amount paid for a mini. This represented an increase of \$1.61 or 2% more for each one.
- \$430 was the amount paid for Barbara Hartmann's *Reclamation : The View* mini and \$350 for *Reclamation of the Heart*.
- Virginia Hauer won the "Viewer's Choice" Ribbon for her *Storms at Sea*.
- 91 miniature quilts were donated by 66 quilters, which translates to a 23% decrease in donations.
- Daphne Huffman donated a total of four quilts to the auction.
- 12 people attended the mini workshop and each person donated a mini.
- 22% is the decreased proceeds from 2009
- 10 postcards brought in \$ 270, a 50% increase in the total postcard sales over last year.
- \$37.50 the amount paid for the *Monarch are Back* postcard
- Priceless---members enthusiasm and support

Everyone's mini makes a difference. If you haven't participated consider doing so in 2011.

Guild membership runs from September 1st until August 31st, so each July we begin the process of collecting renewal forms and dues. The best way to renew is by printing the Membership Form attached to this newsletter and mailing it with a check to the address located at the bottom of the form.

You can also drop off your completed renewal form and payment at the monthly Guild meeting. Starting in July, Membership will have two boxes for renewals, one for forms with a check and another for those with cash. **Please note that if paying with cash, you should include the exact amount as Membership will not have change.** Put your form and payment in a sealed envelope and drop it off as you go into the meeting, and it will be processed by Val Hubbard. We have almost 600 members who renew at the same time. All of the renewal work is done by volunteers who also have full-time jobs, so we need to make this process as efficient and organized as possible. This procedure will help ensure that your payment is properly credited to you and that you receive a membership packet in October.

Deadline for renewals without a \$5 penalty is the September meeting. If you pay after that meeting, whether by mail or at a later meeting, you will need to include the late fee. Also, the September meeting is the cut off date for being included in the Guild directory. Two good reasons to renew as soon as possible!

Upcoming Programs & Workshops

Our guest speaker in August will be Baylor University art professor, Dr. Mary Ruth Smith. A native of Virginia, Dr. Smith joined the art department faculty in 1993, bringing with her the maturity of a long teaching career in two fields of higher education. She has traveled from home economics to art education to art. At Baylor, she has created a studio concentration in fabric surface design. Key course topics include dyeing and printing fabrics, screening techniques, weaving, non-woven fiber/fabric structures and construction methods.

Over the past thirty years her hand stitched artwork has been exhibited extensively throughout the United States and in Canada, England, France, Italy, Korea, Australia, Taiwan, Romania, Venezuela and Ukraine. Recent international exhibitions include Quilt National 2005 & 2007, Visions 2006, Small Expressions at the Robert Hillestad Textile Gallery, University of Nebraska, From Lausanne to Beijing: 4th International Fiber Art Biennale at Tsinghua, University, Beijing, Man+Woman=Creation at the Costa Rica-North American Cultural Center in San Jose, Costa Rica, Scythia 6: International Textile Art Exhibition, Kherson, Ukraine and Pojagis From American Friends at the 5th Cheongju International Craft Exhibition.

Her work has been published in *Fiberarts Design Books Six and Seven*, the *Surface Design Journal*, *Embroidery Magazine*, *Shuttle Spindle and Dyepot*, and *Art Crowd*.

Her lecture on August 5th is entitled "My Journey to Quilt Making."
