


Lola Jenkins





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2012 Helena Hibbs Endowment Grants

The Endowment Committee met Sunday, May 20, 2012 to discuss four grant applications submitted. Members of the committee, including Betty Ann Cox, Carol Dickschat, Shelly Guibert, Marcia Hampton, Marie Zaczkowski, and chairman Joan Wilson, reviewed the applications submitted this year.

The recommendations presented to the Board included two Grant Awards. The decisions made were unanimous for the two projects recommended and the amounts requested for each. The organizations we proposed and received Board approval for are:

La Conner Quilt & Textile Museum:

The project the museum made application for is a result of a donation of quilts, quilt tops, quilt blocks and physical memorabilia such as patterns and family mementos that date from 1890 – 1930, by a Dr. Thomas Schlotterback, who was a professor at Western Washington University in Bellingham, Washington.

Most of the unassembled quilt blocks have been made into quilt tops with a few left as samples of designs and hand piecing of the era.

The primary purpose for the Grant is to allow a group of very talented “hand quilters and hand piecers” to take the tops they received as well as some of those they have assembled, and complete the quilts for exhibition. There are a total of 12 quilt tops requiring completion. The maker of the quilts was Josie (Teeter) Schlotterback. Later quilts were made by Josie and her daughter Mary Teeter.

The museum has hired an appraiser who is advising on the appropriate quilting designs for each individual top and for the historical timeframe during which the blocks were constructed. Prior to making this presentation to the committee, I called Lisa Erlandson to inquire as to what historical impact having the tops quilted at this time would be. She responded that:

Now is the time to recommend a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization, as the recipient of the 2013 Miniature Quilt Auction.

Here are a few tips when submitting your idea:

- Contact the charity that you think should be the recipient and advise them that we are accepting proposals.
- Provide the charity with our contact information if they are interested in submitting a proposal.
- Advise us of whom you contacted.

Proposal guidelines

- Keep the proposal simple. One to two pages at the most. Promotional materials may be included, if applicable.
- Identify when the organization started.
- Provide us with the annual budget.
- Tell us how the funds will be used.
- Pinpoint the need. Why/how will our funds make a difference?
- Is there an in-kind service or partnership that the organization can provide to help us promote the Guild's mission? (i.e. promote the Guild on organization website or newsletter, provide passes to an exhibit, etc.)
- Provide a copy of the IRS 501(c)3 non-profit designation.
- Give us organization contact information. Who we can call if we need more information? (Guild members making proposals should provide your information as well.)

Proposals should be written and submitted to either to Bonnie McElearney (bonnie-mac@sbcglobal.net) or Mary Lord (wrl1explorer@aol.com) by July 15, 2012.

1930's, the Great Depression and Quilting

The Depression era brought a shift in the conservative tradition of quilting to one that involved new patterns and new softer, pastel colors. These 1930's patterns and fabrics are still popular today as evidenced by the Viewer's Choice winner in our last Quilt Celebration.



Our Library has several books that pertain to quilts and quilting during this period:

- *Mary's Favorite 30s Quilts: 11 Designs to Honor Grandma Buddy* by Mary Koval provides clear instructions for all skill levels for making 11 quilts from her own collection of antique quilts from the 1930s.

- **Basic Applique: 1930s Quilt Patterns** by Cindy Walter, teaches 6 basic appliqué methods and provides 18 appliqué patterns from the Golden era of quilting. A gallery of museum quilts from this time period is featured to provide inspiration.
- **Those Fabulous '30s: Sweet Little Quilts to Brighten Your Day** by Gwen Hurlburt uses 1930's-style pastel brights and traditional designs to make 14 charming small quilts.
- **Threads from the '30s; Quilts Using Reproduction Fabrics** edited by Nancy Martin is a collection of 13 projects that reflect the style of the 1930s from some of the top designers including Carol Doak, Mimi Dietrich and Ursula Reikes. A history highlighting fabric designs and colors from this period is included.
- **Soft Covers for Hard Times** by Merikay Waldvogel examines the active and creative work of quiltmakers during the Great Depression. The book addresses two questions: "why were Depression-era quilts generally 'pretty' and why were they so similar all across America?" This is an insightful and engaging look at the hows and whys of this period in quilting.

I would like to publicly thank each member of the committee for their input and diligence at helping to define the most appropriate candidates for our Grant Awards.

I would also like to thank the Board of Directors of our Guild for their approval of our presentations.

- Joan Wilson

- The designs MUST be of the era of the quilt top
- The designs MUST be of the same level of hand stitched quality as the hand piecing
- The labels MUST reflect the date the quilt was started and the current year they were completed.
- By doing all this, the quilts will be much more valuable and have a very positive impact on their value.

With all this information, the committees request was approved to award a grant to the LA CONNER QUILT & TEXTILE MUSEUM in the amount of \$3,800.

Texas Quilt Museum

The remaining grant, in the amount of \$6,200, has been extended to the Texas Quilt Museum, in La Grange, TX. The purpose of their request comes as a result of the numerous requests they have received about the quilts that were in the *Lone Stars III* book, to be made available for exhibition in other areas. They currently have 16 requests pending and another 30 they are contemplating. Only quilts that have been released by their owners for tour and pre-selected by the curator of the exhibits will go on tour. The curator plans to have two exhibits available to tour.

The project (tours) is expected to last up to 2 years and primarily be in Texas venues. Once that is completed, they may try to curate exhibits outside Texas.

They requested \$9,604 and we awarded them \$6,200. The monies are to be used to purchase "useum quality hanging and lighting systems and museum quality shipping tubs. Some of the funds may be used for shipping costs.


