

## Minutes from Quilters Guild of Dallas Meeting April 7, 2022

Held via Zoom and in person. The meeting opened at 6:30 p.m. for social time. Shelly Goodwyn, President, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the first hybrid meeting. The Guild is currently looking for the nominations committee and there are 4 upcoming Board positions that will be vacant; contact Shelly for information.

Shelly Goodwyn presented the Founders Award to Linda Bartley.

Candy Mahaffey announced if you volunteered at the Show for 4 or 8 hours and have not picked up your thank you gift, she has a table tonight and next month to pick it up.

### Committee Reports:

Peggy Cord, 1st Vice President – Community Service, reported that last month we donated 9 quilts to the Ronald McDonald House, 12 quilts to the Dallas Children's Advocacy, and 9 quilts to the Vogel Alcove. They also donated CFK Challenge Quilts from the Quilt Show, about 24 to each of the three charities. The next drop-off will be at Sew Let's Quilt It on April 23, 2022 from 10am – 12pm, with future drop-offs likely in person at meetings.

Marcia Wood, 7th Vice President – Education, recommended pre-folding all lines crisply before paper piecing. Also, she recommends using a Magic Eraser to help clean your iron.

Kathryn Bernstein announced the Guild Store has leftovers for sale from the Quilt Show; stop by and check out the items.

Linda Bartley, 2nd VP – Membership, announced tonight's meeting had 59 attendees on Zoom and 36 in person. If you need a nametag printed out to wear during meetings, sign up to have one printed for the next meeting. We are no longer printing or using membership cards at meetings; sign in by checking your name on the printed list. However, if you want to print a membership card you can print one off of your member profile page on the website (some stores will offer discounts for Guild members). The 2<sup>nd</sup> Spring Stash Super Swap will be May 21, 2022 from 10:30 – 12:30 a.m. at the new Dallas Public Library Forest Green Branch. Details will be on the members' only Facebook page, emails, and a flyer. Anything not taken by members will be donated to a charity. Linda would appreciate volunteers before and after to help set up and break down. If you would like to make donation it will go towards the cost to rent the space and to Community Service.

Shelly invited members forward for Bring and Brag.

Nancy Netherland, 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President – Programs and Workshops, encouraged people to consider being VP for Programs and Workshops next year.
